Maude Childers was the seventh child and fifth daughter. She was born 8 May 1901 and died 29 April 1921 at the age of 20 in Hazard, Perry County, KY. She would have been three years old when her mother, Georgiann, died. She is buried in the Childers Family Cemetery on Lost Creek Road in Perry Co., KY. Maude, lived with Edna and CE for the last five years of her life, and they were responsible for her burial and erection of her tombstone. It is thought that she died of a stomach ailment. The 1920 KY census shows her occupation as school teacher.

Tracing our Lineage

Our efforts to trace our lineage has always halted with Henry Childress/Childers (1730), as our oldest known ancestor. However, extensive research has been ongoing with dedicated researchers such as Virginia Hanks working on our Henry Childers/Susannah Goldsby family. Mark and Gary Childress, list owners of the Childress-L@Rootweb have also been involved in the Childress/Childers DNA project and collection of documents to prove our Childers heritage. Thought the combined efforts of the above researchers and many other people who contributed documents, Thomas Childress 1st/Sr (1705) has been provisionally identified as the father of our Henry Childers. Now that the identification has been made, additional research can be undertaken to further our information about Thomas. At this point, very little is known about him.
